TO CREATE CLASSICAL MUSIC ENDOWMENT**

In May of 2010, St. Louis Public Radio established Classical 90.7 KWMU-3 which broadcasts classical music 24 hours a day, 365 days a year on HD radio and can be streamed at [www.stlpublicradio.org/classical](http://www.stlpublicradio.org/classical). In July of 2010, St. Louis Public Radio added classical music on its main channel, 90.7 KWMU, with the Saturday evening broadcasts of *From the Top* and *SymphonyCast*. Saturday, September 18, 90.7 KWMU began airing live broadcasts of the St. Louis Symphony Wells Fargo Advisors Orchestral Series concerts. On December 18 at 11:30 a.m., Classical 90.7 KWMU-3 will begin airing the Metropolitan Opera as well.
