St. Louis Public Radio Takes a Look Back With “A Good Year” Series

St. Louis Public Radio | 90.7 KWMU will take a look at back at 2012 to spotlight issues, trends and people from the St. Louis region in a special series called “A Good Year.” The series, which begins Monday, December 24 and runs through January 4 during *Morning Edition* and *All Things Considered*, will feature St. Louis Public Radio news stories focusing on positive outcomes in the community.

The series will include stories on the biotech industry in St. Louis; the ad budgets of local television stations in the wake of the “Citizens United” ruling; perspectives from George Allen’s mother; the comeback of vinyl records; LGBT issues; the success of musician Pokey LaFarge; St. Louis’ successful marketing efforts; and Missouri species that thrived despite the summer drought.
