St. Louis Public Radio | 90.7 KWMU and Quincy Public Radio | 90.3 WQUB will be making the following program changes effective Monday, July 1, 2013:

The Takeaway with host John Hockenberry will air at 11 a.m. As a result of this change, *St. Louis on the Air/Cityscape* will now air at 12 p.m. *Fresh Air* will now air at 9 p.m. As a result of this change, St. Louis Public Radio will no longer air the second hour of *On Point*.

The Takeaway is a national news program that delivers the news and analysis. Host John Hockenberry, along with the *The New York Times* and WGBH Boston, invites listeners every morning to learn more and be part of the American conversation. *The Takeaway* is a unique partnership of global news leaders. It is a co-production of PRI (Public Radio International) and WNYC Radio in collaboration with The New York Times and WGBH Boston.

Here & Now with co-hosts **Robin Young** and **Jeremy Hobson**, will air at 1 p.m. As a result of this change, NPRs *Talk of the Nation and Science Friday*'s final broadcast on St. Louis Public Radio will be Friday, June 28.
