Announce Program Changes:
*The World Returns, Q to Replace Tell Me More***

St. Louis Public Radio | 90.7 KWMU and Quincy Public Radio | 90.3 WQUB will be making the following program changes effective Monday, August 4, 2014:

PRI's The World returns to the St. Louis Public Radio lineup beginning **Monday, August 4, 2014** and will air Monday - Friday from 2-3 p.m. As a result of this change, St. Louis Public Radio will no longer air *Here & Now*.

PRI's The World is your world revealed. It's about the events, trends, and personal tales that connect us around the globe. **Marco Werman** hosts an hour of surprising angles, unexpected insights, and engaging voices to illuminate what's going on in the world, and why it matters.

The program *Q* will debut on St. Louis Public Radio on **Monday, August 4, 2014**, and will air Monday- Friday in the 7-8 p.m. time slot vacated as the result of NPR ceasing the production of *Tell Me More*.

Q, hosted by **Jian Ghomeshi**, is an energetic daily arts, culture and entertainment magazine that takes listeners on a smart and surprising ride, interviewing personalities and tackling the cultural issues that matter. *Q* brings big names, big ideas, and those paving the way on the cultural landscape. *Q* is produced by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) and distributed by Public Radio International (PRI).

“We are sad to see *Tell Me More* come to an end,” said General Manager Tim Eby, “but we are excited to introduce *Q* to the St. Louis market and bring *PRI's The World* back to our weekday program schedule.”
