JAZZ STATION ADDED TO ST. LOUIS PUBLIC RADIO
THE GATEWAY REBRANDED TO THE BRIDGE ON QUINCY PUBLIC RADIO

St. Louis Public Radio | 90.7 KWMU is pleased to announce the addition of jazz to its broadcast schedule. Beginning today, **St. Louis Public Radio | Jazz 90.7 KWMU-2** will air jazz music 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Listeners can access the programming on their digital radios at 90.7 KWMU-2, online at www.stlpublicradio.org/jazz, and on all of their mobile devices. As a result of this change, The Gateway 90.7 KWMU-2 has moved to Quincy Public Radio | 90.3 WQUB-2 and has been rebranded as The Bridge.

Jazz 90.7 KWMU-2 will feature recordings from many legends of the genre, as well as new music from emerging artists world-wide.
